

## MILITIA ARTICLES

- Article 1 The Uniform of the company Shall be caps Red Coats faced with Black cloth. Black Stocks white Waiscoats & pantaloons with Black Cord in the Seams and Black half gators with Red Tops
- Art 2 Any person wishing to join the company shall Make application to one of the members who shall propose him at the next legall Meeting and the person shall stand as a candidate at the Next legall Meeting
- Art 3 No person shall be admitted a member of the company without the vote of two thirds of the members present
- Art 4 Any person being admitted a member of the company shall pay the Clerk the sum of one dollar for his Entrance
- Art 5 Any person after becoming a member shall provide himself with a complete uniform within three months otherwise not to be considered as a Member unless some reasonable Excuse is offered to the company within thirty days after
- Art 6 Each Member for any deficientcy Either in Clothing or accutriments on parade day shall pay a fine of fifty cents for the Benefit of the Company
- Art 7 Any Member appearing on parade on days of Publick training with his clothes not clean and his hair not powdered shall pay a fine of fifty cents for the use of the company
- Art 8 The Clerk of the company shall call the Roll at the opening and close of the Meeting and any Member Abcent at the first Rolle call shall pay a fine of twelve & half cents – if abcent at Evening Roll Call shall pay a fine of twenty five cents for the use of the company
- Art 9 When Ever the company is ordered out by the commanding officer in uniform Every Member shall attend or pay a fine of two dollars, if some Reasonable Excuse is not made within Eight days to the commanding officer unless sick or out of town
- Art 10 Any Member Refusing to pay the fine demanded of him by the Clerk or Abcenting himself from the company at four Publick trainings without a Reasonable Excuse shall Be offered to the commanding officer shall be voted from the Company and not be considered as a worthy Member

Art 11 Any Member wishing to leave the Company shall give his Reasons to the Company in writing to lay before the company for his Dismission

Art 12 That to every motion which is carried by a Majority and which is Not Evidently Unjust the Majority shall consider themselves Bound chearfully to submit – and willingly suffer an inconvince which is for the good of the whole
